## Groups & Families Discussion Questions

## ***Life Group Questions***

1. Conversation starter: If someone offered to give you any gift completely free — but not money, and you had to carry it with you everywhere for a week — what would you pick?
2. What does Paul mean by “the gospel” in verses 1–4, and how does he describe its essential content? How can we stay focused on the simplicity and clarity of the gospel in a world full of religious confusion?
3. Paul says the gospel is something he “received.” Why is it important that we receive the gospel rather than work for it?
4. In verse 2, Paul says, “By this gospel you are saved.” What kind of salvation is in view here— eternal salvation, spiritual growth, or both? How can we tell?
5. Paul emphasizes the resurrection as central to the gospel. Why is the resurrection such an important part of the message of grace?
6. In verse 10, Paul says, “By the grace of God I am what I am.” How does this verse challenge both pride and shame in the Christian life?
7. Paul worked hard in response to grace, not to earn it. How can we guard against both legalism (working for grace) and passivity (ignoring grace)? What motivates you personally to serve God?
8. Who in your life needs to hear the simple, grace-filled message of the gospel? How can your small group support each other in sharing it with clarity and boldness this week?
