4. v19 warns against having minds set on earthly things. What does this mean? How does that compare to D L Moody's scolding Christians for being 'so heavenly minded they were no earthly good'?
5. How does being a citizen of heaven impact Christian values versus societies values?
6. What does it mean to live 'eagerly awaiting a saviour'? (3:20)
