Life Group Questions

- 1) Conversation starter: Have you ever experienced being rescued from a near death incident? How did you respond to the rescuer? OR
Have you ever rescued someone and how did they respond to you?
- 2) Are you familiar with the process of butchering an animal? (If not squeamish, you could watch a video). When you read Leviticus in light of that process, is it something you would be willing to do? Why or why not?
- 3) Can you understand how costly these sacrifices were for the Hebrews? Does the thought "what a waste" make sense? What of yours would you not be willing to turn into smoke for God?
- 4) When you give to God are you expecting something/s in return? If so, what? And why do you think that?
- 5) Who in Mark 14:1-11 is contrasted with the woman and how? Which of the two contrasted characters do you identify with more and why?
- 6) What is holding you back from your life being a living sacrifice? Is it a low view of God's mercy or a high view of your own worthiness?
- 7) How are you going to extravagantly sacrifice to our worthy God this week?
