Groups & Families Discussion Questions

Follow along with the sermon and use these questions to dive a little deeper with your group, with your families at home or for your own personal reflection.

Sermon Notes: Can you identify the main point, the subpoints and application of today's message?

Life Group Questions

1. Conversation Starter: What is a small “coincidence” or funny unexpected moment in your life that turned out better than you first thought?
2. Read Exodus 2:1–10 together. What details in the story stand out to you that show the courage, wisdom, or faith of Moses’ mother, sister, and Pharaoh’s daughter?
3. Moses’ parents hid him “by faith” and “were not afraid of the king’s edict” (Hebrews 11:23). What do you think faithful courage looked like for them in that moment? What might faithful courage look like for Christians today?
4. Moses’ mother placed him in the Nile, the very place Pharaoh had commanded Hebrew boys to be killed. How does this part of the story help us think about trusting God when we have done all we can and the outcome is out of our hands?
5. Miriam watched from a distance and then stepped forward at just the right moment. What can we learn from her about paying attention, being ready, and taking wise action?
6. Pharaoh’s daughter shows compassion for a vulnerable child, even though he belonged to an oppressed people. Where might God be calling us to show costly compassion, especially toward the weak, helpless, or overlooked?
7. The sermon reminded us that even when God’s hand can’t be seen, His fingerprints are all over the story. Looking back, where can you see God’s fingerprints in your own life? Where do you need to trust that He is still at work, even if you cannot see it yet?
