Groups & Families Discussion Questions

Follow along with the sermon and use these questions to dive a little deeper with your group, with your families at home or for your own personal reflection.

Sermon Notes: Can you identify the main point, the subpoints and application of today's message?

Life Group Questions

1. Conversation Starter: What's a completely harmless opinion or preference that you'll happily defend, even though you know other people disagree?
2. Our culture often equates disagreement with intolerance. Can you think of examples where people are happy to be "exclusive" or "intolerant" in everyday life, but object when Christianity makes exclusive truth claims?
3. Read John 14:1–11 together. Jesus doesn't simply claim to *know* the way to God—He claims to *be* the way. What stands out to you about His words, and why do you think they would have been so confronting then (and now)?
4. The real question isn't whether Jesus made an exclusive claim, but whether He had the authority to make it. What gives you confidence that Jesus has the right to make such a claim?
5. The gospel is exclusive in its means ("through Me") but inclusive in its invitation ("whoever believes"). How does holding these two truths together protect us from both pride and compromise?
6. The application challenged us to have confidence, conviction and compassion. Which of those three comes most naturally to you, and which one do you most need God to grow in? Why?
7. Is there someone in your life who needs to hear the invitation of Jesus? Without naming anyone if it's inappropriate, what is one practical step you could take this week to pray for them, love them well, or begin a spiritual conversation?
